Subject: NOTICE OF LICENSE EXPIRATION AND ASSUMPTION OF LICENSING BY
AGREEMENT STATE

Gentlemen:

Notice is given that AEC byproduct material License No. 4-4292-1 will
expire on November 30, 1962.

Effective September 1, 1962, the state of California, through an agree-
ment with the Atomic Energy Commission, assumed regulatory authority
over licensing of byproduct material possessed and used in the state.
You should contact the Bureau of Radiological Health, State Department
of Public Health, 2151 Berkeley Way, Berkeley 4, California, concerning
the renewal of this license and the requirements for possession and use
of byproduct material in California.

Condition No. 11 of License No. 4-4292-1 authorizes out-of-state use
for a small amount of Cobalt 60 to demonstrate a section from a rocket
engine nozzle. Out-of-state use of this material remains under license
authority of the Atomic Energy Commission or under licensing authority
of another Agreement State. If such use is in another Agreement State
(see attached list), you should contact the State Department of Health
concerning that state's licensing requirements. If materials are used
in non-Agreement States, you should determine if the reciprocity pro-
visions of the general license in Section 150.20, 10 CFR 150 (copy enclosed),
will serve your needs. If it does not and you desire to continue the
demonstration program, you should apply to the AEC for renewal of that
part of your license which will cover use in states where licensing is
still under AEC jurisdiction.

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The following procedure should be used in submitting a renewal application for that part of your program to be covered under AEC licensing authority. Where there have been no changes whatever from your previous AEC application with respect to uses in non-Agreement States, please (1) complete Items 1 through 7 and Item 15 of Form AEC-313, listing your previous license number with the word "Renewal" in Item 3, and (2) properly sign Item 16.

If there have been changes in your program in connection with uses in non-Agreement States, please (1) complete Items 1 through 7 and Item 15 of Form AEC-313, (2) indicate changes in appropriate Items 8 through 14, and (3) properly sign Item 16.

It is to your advantage to file your application for an AEC license at least thirty (30) days before the expiration date of your existing license. That part of your program subject to AEC licensing authority will then be covered by your existing license until we can issue you a new license (Title 10, Code of Federal Regulations, Part 30, Section 30.35(b)). If applications received less than thirty days prior to the expiration date of your license cannot be processed before your existing license expires, this could result in your possessing radioisotopes in non-Agreement States without a valid license.

This notice is sent to you for your convenience and it should not be interpreted that similar notices will be sent in the future. The responsibility for license renewal remains with the licensee.
