SUBJECT: SUMMARY OF PUBLIC MEETING CONDUCTED FOR THE
DRAFT SUPPLEMENTAL ENVIRONMENTAL IMPACT
STATEMENT FOR THE NORTH ANNA POWER STATION,
UNIT 3 COMBINED LICENSE APPLICATION

On Tuesday, February 3, 2009, members of the U.S. Nuclear Regulatory Commission (NRC) staff held a public meeting at the Louisa County High School in Mineral, Virginia concerning the staff's environmental review of the combined license application submitted by the Virginia Electric Power Company doing business as Dominion Virginia Power and the Old Dominion Electric Cooperative collectively referred to as Dominion. The purpose of the meeting was to present the preliminary findings of NUREG-1917, draft "Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (SEIS) for the Combined License (COL) for North Anna Power Station, Unit 3" and provide the public with an opportunity to comment on the draft SEIS which was issued in December 2008.

Formal presentations, including the NRC preliminary recommendation, were made by the NRC and its contractor, the Pacific Northwest National Laboratory. The staff's preliminary recommendation is that the COL be issued. This preliminary recommendation is based on: (1) the application, including the Environmental Report (ER) submitted by Dominion; (2) the staff's review conducted for the ESP application and documented in the ESP EIS; (3) consultation with Federal, State, Tribal and local agencies; (4) the staff's own independent review of potential new and significant information available since preparation and publication of the ESP EIS; (5) the staff's consideration of comments received during the public scoping process; and (6) the assessments summarized in this SEIS including the potential mitigation measures identified.

After the formal presentations were given by the staff, members of the public were invited to provide comments. Approximately 120 people attended the meeting. Attendees included members of the public and media, representatives of the NRC, representatives from public interest groups, the nuclear industry, Dominion, and State and local government officials. Comments were in support of, and opposition to the COL application. Public comments were mainly focused on environmental impacts to Lake Anna, socioeconomics, recreation, and tourism.

In an effort to improve communication and increase interaction with members of the public, the NRC staff conducted an open house one hour before the meeting. During the open house, the staff provided displays and brochures and met with members of the public to answer questions about the proposed COL application for North Anna, Unit 3. Enclosure 1 is a list of attendees. Enclosure 2 is the corrected meeting transcript with attachments. Enclosure 3 is a copy of the meeting slides. The comment period on the draft SEIS ends on March 20, 2009.
