


Construction Inspection Assessment Process Panel

 - Understandable
 - Risk-Informed and Performance Based
- Transparent to stakeholders
- Cornerstones to focus resources and communication
- Significance of findings risk informed
- Graduated, focused NRC response
- However, performance indicators are not appropriate
