CLARIFICATION OF 10 CFR 19.11(a)

This memorandum is written to document the answer to a question, which arose during an enforcement case, concerning the meaning of 10 CFR 19.11(a).

10 CFR 19.11(a) states that, "Each licensee shall post current copies of the following documents: (1) The regulations in this part and in Part 20 of this chapter; (2) the license, license conditions, or documents incorporated into a license by reference, and amendments thereto; (3) the operation procedures applicable to licensed activities; (4) any notice of violation involving radiological working conditions, proposed imposition of civil penalty, or order issued pursuant to Subpart B of Part 2 of this chapter, and any response form the licensee."

The question was whether the requirement for posting proposed civil penalties, orders, and responses from licensees applies only to those proposed civil penalties, orders, and responses relevant to radiological working conditions. The answer is given in the statement of considerations for 10 CFR Part 19 (38 FR 22217, August 17, 1973), as follows: "It has been clarified that the requirement in §19.11 for posting notices of violations, notices of proposed imposition of civil penalty, or orders issued pursuant to Subpart B of Part 2 of this chapter, applies only to documents relevant to radiological working conditions."
