*The Nuclear Regulatory Commission has held a number of public meetings with both industry representatives and external stakeholders in an effort to establish a predictable environment and process to assist those licensees transitioning to Title 10 of the *Code of Federal Regulations* Section 50.48(c). In this regard, a number of documents have been prepared to assist licensees in the preparation of license amendment requests (LARs) as well as documents to ensure a consistent review by the NRC staff. These documents include Regulatory Guide 1.205 (December 2009), Section 9.5.1.2 of the Standard Review Plan (December 2009), and a template for safety evaluations (December 2010). In addition, the Nuclear Energy Institute has transmitted Revision C of the LAR template for licensees' use.
