4	This is the second day of the 675th Meeting of the
5	Advisory Committee on Reactor Safeguards. I'm Matthew
6	Sunseri, the Chair of the ACRS. I will conduct a roll
7	call. Members, please acknowledge your presence. Ron
8	Ballinger?
9	MEMBER BALLINGER: Here.
10	CHAIR SUNSERI: Dennis Bley?
11	MEMBER BLEY: Here.

session. The outline for today looks as follows. We're going to begin with an open session here with NuScale, and then it's mainly just to close out from yesterday's session to see if there's any follow-ups or final comments from members that need to be addressed.

Me'll allow the public an opportunity to make some final comments for that session, and then we will break off and close down the transcript and go into a closed session with NuScale offline. We will be in closed session more than likely until 1:30 today at which we'll break for lunch, and then return in open session at 2:30 today to take up the TRISO report on the topical -- the report that we're preparing on TRISO. Sorry for getting tongue-tied there.

That will be an open session and most likely the time where we will come back into open session. But since there is a little bit of uncertainty about what the schedule looks like this morning and there's a potential that we could come back into open session with NuScale, we are going to have the ACRS staff monitoring the public line and providing periodic updates. And Scott Moore, are you available to discuss the logistics for that?

MR. MOORE: Yes, Mr. Chairman. We will

have a staff member, likely Larry, come on -- one of our branch chiefs come on, on the hour and give an update each hour between now and lunch for anybody that's on the public line. So once each hour, we'll give an update.

CHAIR SUNSERI: Okay. Thank you. I just want to be open and fair on this with the expectation so that people just -- well, I really don't anticipate coming back open until 2:30. But as we said, it's a contingency. And then we had some challenges with Skype yesterday, and I'm going to ask Christiana Lui of our staff to give us some update on the virtual meeting protocol and how we may avoid some problems today. Christiana?

MS. LUI: Okay. So one of the things that we have reminded everybody several times is that when not speaking, please, please mute your mic. And yesterday, we understand that it was a very engaging session. But there were at one time simply too many open mics, and that degrades the sound quality for everybody.

So what we're going to do today is that if we sense that it's going back to that particular stage, we're going to place block mute on everybody. That means that nobody will be able to speak. And we

will remind everybody once we release the block mute, please go and then mute yourself if you're not speaking. We understand that sometimes people open -- I mean, keep their mic open so they can jump in as soon as possible.

I think that we have conducted enough virtual meetings, people will know to wait a little bit for people to open their mic. Part of the reason we're going to have to do the block mute because there are too many people on the session for us to be able to scroll up and down and take your individual mic. That would just simply take too long.

Therefore, please watch your mic. And if you have your mic on the Smart Mic setting, in other words, that some of the mics will be set in such a way there is a sound, you soon as are automatically. Sometimes your mic is actually open when you're not intending to speak. While you're shuffling paper, there's some background noise. So be careful with that.

And if we do sense that there are more degradation, we're looking to where there is some system server issue. Yesterday, we confirmed that there was not a system server issue. So whatever was happening was happening locally within our session.

1 Therefore, we really appreciate everybody's cooperation today to carefully monitor your mic when 2 3 not speaking. Thank you. Thank you, Matt. Turning 4 back to you. 5 CHAIR SUNSERI: Thank you, Christiana. 6 And that's a good reminder. I mean, it's -- okay. 7 thing I wanted to say here just as a 8 reminder, when we go into the open session on the 9 TRISO report, I just want to acknowledge that Members 10 Petti and Vice Chair Rempe will be recused from the TRISO discussions. So with that, we can now go into 11 the --12 VICE CHAIR REMPE: Matt, just to be clear, 13 14 though, we are expected still to listen in and make 15 factual corrections or not? 16 CHAIR SUNSERI: Yes. I mean --17 VICE CHAIR REMPE: Okay. Thank you. CHAIR SUNSERI: Members do not participate 18 19 in the outcome of the deliberation but may provide factual corrections. Okay. So that's it. We can now 20 21 go into the NuScale business. I would ask if any members have any follow-up questions from yesterday's 22 session after you had a chance to think about it. 23 24 Actually, I'm out of place here. Let me turn it over

to Member Kirchner, the lead for this area to open up

this session. I apologize for getting in front of you, Walt.

MEMBER KIRCHNER: Quite all right, Mr. Chairman. So I'll just, at this point, turn to my colleagues. And does anyone want to make a statement before we break off from this open session and go to the closed session?

Mr. Chairman, hearing no input from my colleagues, I think we should proceed to the closed session and the staff's presentations.

CHAIR SUNSERI: Okay. And just before we do that, I just want to, once again, remind everybody we are in open dialogue on this topic. And what you're hearing a lot of times is individual members comment probing the topic. But I would remind everybody that the ACRS has not formulated any conclusions or opinions on any other topics that we are discussing this week. And we'll only do so and communicate those through our written reports.

So I just wanted to keep everything in perspective as we proceed through these deliberations. So I guess at this point, we can open the public line up to see if there's any public comments for our interest at this time. So Thomas, can we open the public line?

1 MR. DASHIELL: The public line is open for 2 comment. 3 CHAIR SUNSERI: Thank you. If there are 4 any members of the public that care to make a comment 5 or make a statement at this time, please do so. MS. FIELDS: Yes, this is Sarah Fields 6 with Uranium Watch in Monticello, Utah. 7 I hope that 8 the transcript of these proceedings will be made 9 available as soon as possible. These transcripts are 10 relevant to the public. They're relevant to people in Utah who will be rate payers for a proposed NuScale 11 design project. 12 transcripts relevant 13 The are NRC 14 rulemaking that has to do with emergency planning. So 15 I hope as soon as possible these transcripts and any 16 letter report that comes from this 17 deliberations will also be made publicly available as soon as possible. Thank you. 18 19 CHAIR SUNSERI: Thank you for those 20 comments. Anyone else? Hey, Matt, this is Larry 21 MR. BURKHART: Burkhart. I'm on the public line. I just wanted to 22 let everyone know with respect to the updates you were 23 24 talking about -- Scott was talking about that I will provide the first update at 11:00 o'clock about the 25
